

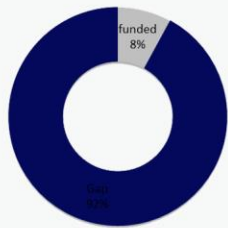
# FACT SHEET 2020

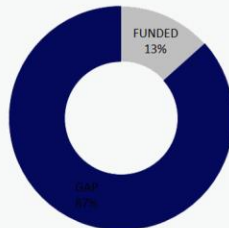

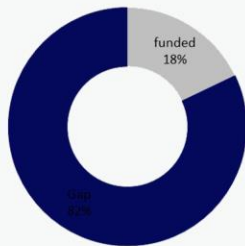

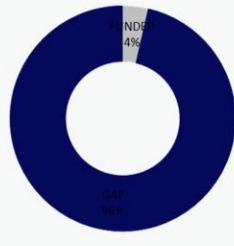

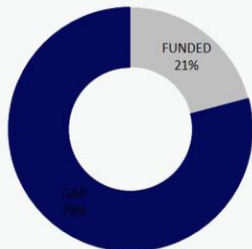

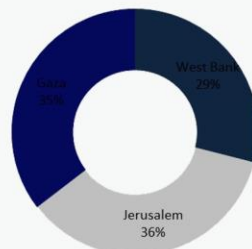

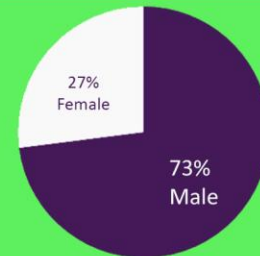
